

About Call Numbers

The San Bernardino County Law Library uses the Library of Congress Classification (LCC) system.

LCC is an alpha-numeric method of organizing and cataloging items, unlike the *Dewey Decimal system*, which primarily uses numbers. The Library of Congress designates letters and numbers to represent subject areas.

- The letter "K" has been assigned by the Library of Congress to the subject of law.
- The letters "KF" refer to United States law.
- The letters "KFC" with the ranges 1-1199 will refer to California law.
