Yes, you must be a resident of San Bernardino County.

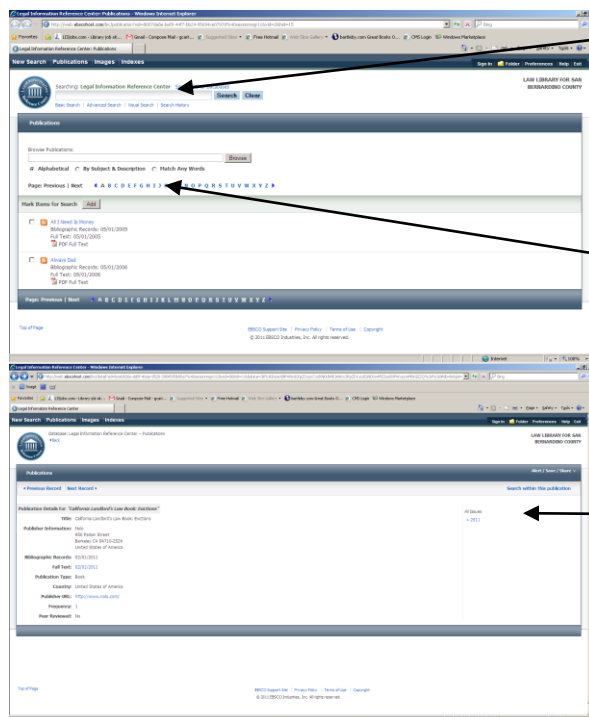
## Do I need a password?

You may need to use the following information and password: "ca"/"sanb" for access.

## How do I find the book that I want?

Click on publications and then you can type the title of the book you are looking for or search the listing alphabetically.

Once you have selected a title you can select the issue of that title to the right. You should select the most recent edition.



You can search for your publication by entering the title in the search box.

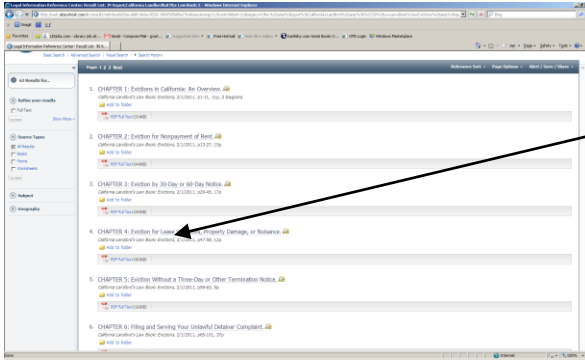
Search for the title alphabetically by selecting the letter that corresponds to the title of your book.

Select the year or edition of the book to the right.

## Searching through the book

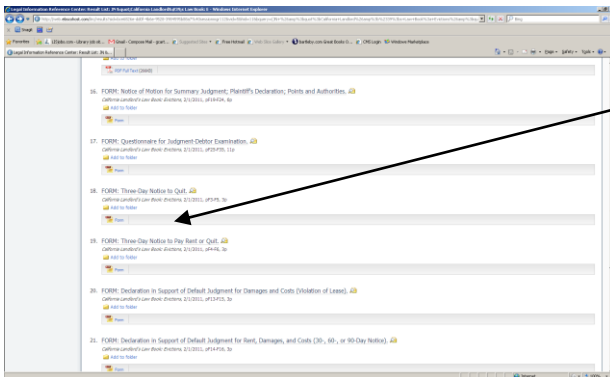
The electronic book will be divided by chapters. Find the chapter you would like to read and click on the option to open the chapter in PDF.



Select the chapter you want to view.

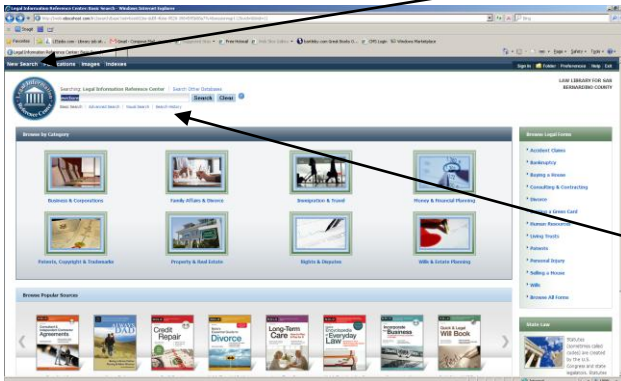
## Searching for a form in a book

Forms related to the content of a book are available in PDF follow immediately after the list of chapters.



Scroll down the page to find any forms related to the content of the book. Select to download in PDF.

**Can I search multiple Nolo Press books?**  
To search multiple titles select “New Search” on top of the screen you will be redirected to the main page where you can keyword search areas of law.



Just type in the topic you would like to search in the search box. The search will return with results from our available titles in The Legal Information Reference Center.
